Social Workers can help with:

- Advocacy for clients and families
- Education and information
- Referral to support services
- Access to community resources
- Crisis support & intervention
- Facilitate family meetings
- Short term counselling support
- Grief, loss and bereavement support
- · Adjustment to illness or changed circumstances
- Facilitate communication and collaboration between health teams
- Guidance and information about relevant financial and legal concerns
- Continuity of care
- Discharge planning
