In March 2021, a Community Consultative Committee was established to help guide the Ballarat Base Hospital's \$541.6 million redevelopment.

Ballarat's Simon Dwyer was one of 16 community members appointed to the committee led by former Premier Steve Bracks and the city's two state MPs. The committee was joined by representatives from Ballarat Health Services, the Ballarat and District Aboriginal Cooperative (BADAC) and the City of Ballarat and provided a great insight into what the community wanted in the redeveloped hospital.

The upgraded hospital will provide a new emergency department, state-of-the-art theatre suite and an extra 100 additional inpatient and short stay beds. A new and expanded critical care floor will also bring together operating theatres, procedure rooms and endoscopy suites – offering the capacity for an additional 4,000 surgeries every year.

With the final stage expected to be completed in 2027, the upgraded hospital will have the capacity to treat at least 18,000 more emergency patients and an extra 14,500 inpatients per year.

Hosted by Ballarat Health Services, GPHU is responsible for COVID-19 activities including COVID-19 Case Contact Outbreak Management (CCOM), COVID-19 Rapid Response Testing Team (RRTT), and the Grampians COVID-19 vaccination program. The GPHU works closely with the Department of Health and in partnership with health services and other agencies throughout the Grampians region.

The Grampians Prevention and Recovery Care (PARC) centre opened in August to provide much needed short-term treatment and support for people experiencing mental illness in the Ballarat and Grampians region.

The centre greatly assists Ballarat Health Services' capacity to provide those with a mental illness with early intervention and recovery support in a dedicated state-of-the-art facility.

The centre has six beds for short stays of up to 28 days, and a further six beds for clients who need a longer stay (three to six months) to receive clinical support and stabilisation, and psychosocial rehabilitation before returning home.

Grampians PARC uses a recovery oriented framework encompassing principles of selfdetermination and personalised care. It also aims to keep patients connected to their support networks and community while they receive treatment.
