EMERGENCY MEDICINE TRAINING PATHWAY

To be eligible to apply to enter the **Australasian College for Emergency Medicine (ACEM)** Training Program you must:

Be a registered medical practitioner in the

- jurisdiction in which you plan to work
- Have completed a minimum of 24 months postgraduate clinical experience in a teaching

Candidates may apply if they are in at least their second postgraduate year (PGY2) and have completed a minimum of:

- one full term (8 weeks) in emergency medicine *
- two full terms (16 weeks) in two different disciplines other than emergency medicine
- * Intern terms in emergency medicine (PGY1) are not included in the minimum but may be for other disciplines.

majority of their training.

Trainees must also undertake training in:

- anaesthesia and/or intensive care
- additional placements in non-emergency posts and/or areas of special skill - such as toxicology, retrieval, medical education, and research

Stages of Training

The Training Program comprises the following stages of training:

- 1. Provisional Training: from enrolment as a Provisional Trainee until completion of all requirements of Provisional Training
- 2. Advanced Training Stage 1: from start of Advanced Training until completion of all of the 'early phase' emergency medicine requirements (the first 12 months of the required 30 months)
- 3. Advanced Training Stage 2: from progression into 'late phase' emergency medicine training (the remaining 18 months of the required 30 months of core ED training) until commencement of Stage 3
- 4. Advanced Training Stage 3: from completion of 36 FTE months Advanced Training until elected to Fellowship

Critical care, non ED & discretionary training time may be completed at any stage of Advanced Training
